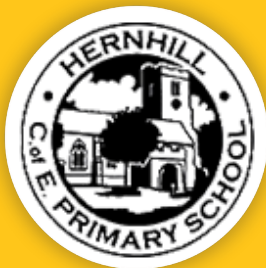

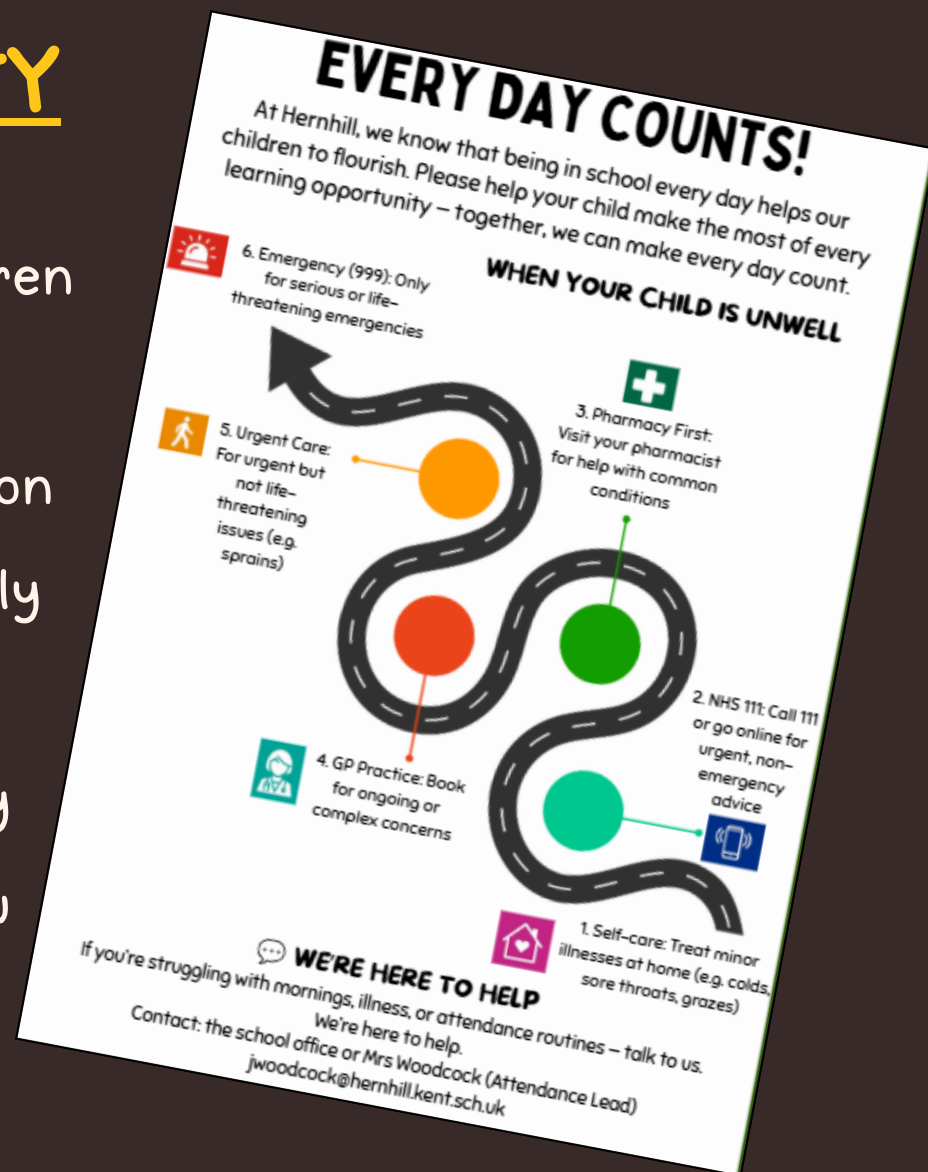


ATTENDANCE & PUNCTUALITY

Keeping Children Safe Online

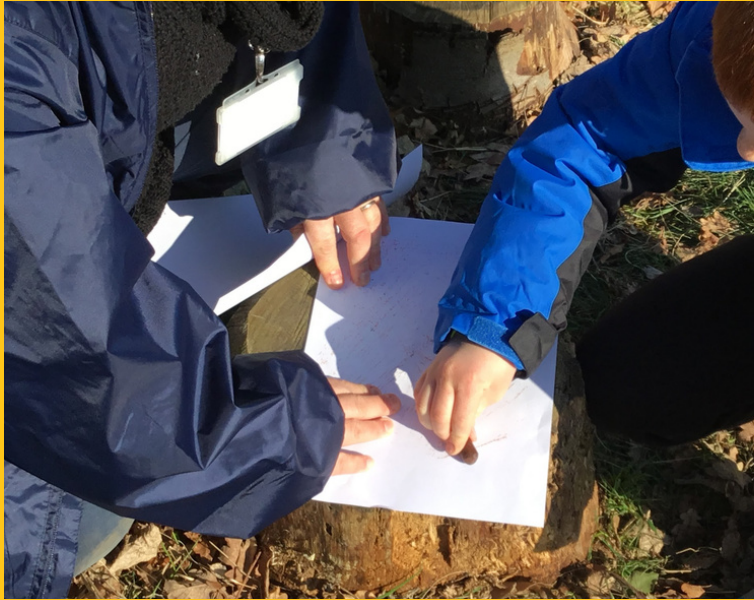
 Over the next few weeks, the class will be exploring our "Internet Acceptable Use" agreement – helping children understand how to stay safe and respectful online.

Reading books and Reading Records at Hernhill



 Regular reading – children should read at least 5 times a week. Good practice from last year – what ever works for your child and your routine.

 With an adult – sharing the book and talking about it is really important. For some re-reading the book,(perhaps more independently) is very empowering.

Stop if becomes too tricky, celebrate the postitives and come and chat if you need support.

Please sign the reading record after each session.

 Changing books – officially, this will be on a Monday and Thursday and then we will work towards changing it as and when they need to.

Confidence, attitude towards reading, reading age, word recognition and comprehension assessments will all support the decsion making when putting your child on a reading band.



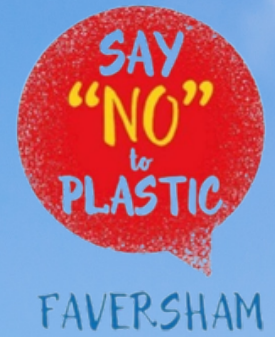

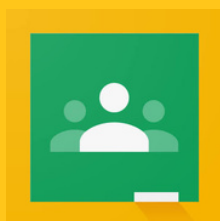

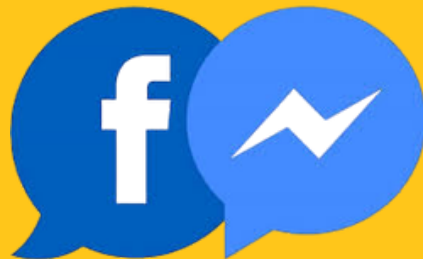
